Interior finishes err on the cheap side while engine refinement also lags behind rivals.

CHEVROLET SONIC

It can be considered a stop gap between the Aveo and Cruze hatch, yet offers similar specification levels to the smaller sibling. The front end design, with its four circular headlights, is said to have been inspired by a motorbike. The hatch variant boasts a better looking body form than the sedan and the 1.61 engine offers adequate power for the daily commute. However, steer clear of the

automatic transmission as it causes the engine to
