hoosing a medium family car is not an easy task. These days it has to be able to survive the urban jungle, do the school run, carry the kids to soccer practice and still traverse the length and breadth of SA on the weekend or during the school holidays.

Do you put style before practicality? Hatchback or sedan? Diesel, petrol or even hybrid? The choices in this segment seem almost endless but some basic rules still apply. If you are looking for an all-rounder then make sure it has versatility. Do the rear seats fold down for

extra storage or longer loads? How practical is the boot space? Be wary of hatchbacks which have a stylish coupe-inspired rear end which sometimes cuts off part of the boot space. If you only need to drop in a shopping bag then fine, but if you need to get the football kit for three teenagers in there, you might battle.

A sedan might give you that executive look but if you need a car that you can put the dog in, then a hatchback is a better option. A crossover would also fit the bill. Some crossover models have a bit of go-anywhere ability but some are all just show. Decide if you want something to look cool outside the pavement cafe or if you really are going to have to drive across a field on the weekend.

Finally, the whole point of a family car is that it suits the needs of the family. Does it have good mounting points for a child seat? Are there USB ports for the kids' iPods? Will the car accommodate the family as it grows? There are so many things to consider you might think style is way down the list, but a car is often a reflection of you so always buy the best you can afford — just make sure the kids like it, too.

# **CHEVROLET CRUZE**

Launched in 2009, the Chevrolet Cruze has made significant inroads into the medium segment of the market and plays second fiddle only to the Toyota Corolla in the sales charts. The model has recently been given a turbo-charged engine, which gives it a competitive edge among its rivals. Mid-specification LS models have also received added kit, making for a good value for money proposition. Diesel models are great, but for the equivalent money you are better off buying an Opel Astra sedan.

# **CITROEN**

That said it will present a great bargain for those shopping in the pre-owned space, maintenance costs notwithstanding.

To its credit the vehicle offers acres of space both from the passenger and the luggage quarters. The engine is lacklustre and lacks the overall refinement of its

However, the rear window spoiler hinders rearward vision, while the digital speedometer is also awkwardly obstructed by the steering rim. Resale value is one of the marque's inherent highlights. # **NISSAN SENTRA**

# **PEUGEOT 308**

A bit of a left field player in the segment, the 308, much like Citroen C4, is an excellent hatch with good styling, a spacious interior and comfortable ride. The transmission in the non-turbo model could be better and the engine does feel a little under powered on the reef. An all-new model is currently standing in the wings, so it will be interesting to see how it fares when it gets here later in 2014.

# **RENAULT FLUENCE**

Perhaps not the most exciting offering, the Fluence has good standard specification including a standard satellite navigation system, excellent ride comfort, and a large boot. The 2.0l engine offers decent performance, but it is perhaps the 1.6 model that makes economic sense. A recent facelift replete with LED daytime driving lights and has managed to elevate the vehicle's styling somewhat. ### **RENAULT MEGANE**

With a comprehensive range and good pricing point, the Megane offers something a little different to other segment offerings. The coupe offers unique styling and good convenience items, but it is a little cramped in the rear and the rear view via the narrow rear window is not great. A turbo diesel offering in the coupe would be a welcome addition, but the 1.61 Expression is excellent value

### **SUBARU** XV

A crossover hatch with the ability to traverse gravel roads with aplomb, thanks to the raised suspension and all-wheel drive mechanism, meaning the model will appeal to the more lifestyle oriented buyer. The interior is well laid out with good ergonomics and materials. However, engine performance is lacklustre, the gearbox is poor and boot space is decidedly compromised due to the high boot floor.

# **TOYOTA AURIS**

Featuring sharper styling than its predecessor, the Auris is now a more attractive proposition. Interior appointments are good although some materials, particularly on the door padding could be better. The 1.6 engine lacks power, and while we have not drive it, we would expect the 1.3l to be perhaps even more asthmatic up on the reef.
